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SUPERINTENDENT'S NEWS

News of another school shooting in Tennessee has us all thinking about school safety and security again. It's not that we really ever stop thinking about it, but when events like this occur it brings the issue to the forefront. It does not seem right that we must be prepared to protect children in our schools from gun violence, but that is the reality of the world we live in.

We have an established crisis plan which is reviewed with staff at the beginning of each school year. While we understand that parents may want to know all of the specifics of our plans, it is important to keep some details private in order to protect them from any potential bad actors. We periodically practice lockdown drills and talk through our procedures with students.

Our district is equipped with the SafeDefend system. In the event that there is a violent intruder, the system will be activated and will provide immediate notification to all staff members and law enforcement officers with the location of the threat. Every classroom also has a safe with equipment to keep students and staff safe. More information about SafeDefend and is available on our website or in the school offices.

We also contract with Providence Working Canines. This company provides regular safety sweeps of the school campus. The dogs search for illegal drugs, alcohol, gunpowder, and other items that should not be at school. This is a bit different than a police dog that will only look for illegal drugs. During each visit, the dog handlers also provide input to school administration about how to keep our school safe and secure.

There is a controlled entrance on the south side at the elementary/district office. No one may enter the school without first going through the office. One recent change is that the doors at the north main entrance are locked during the school day. We are in the process of adding a camera and doorbell for those doors. Until that is installed, visitors must call the office to be allowed entry into the building. If parents have specific questions or concerns about school safety and security, they should contact the school office.

The board of education has approved the academic calendar for the 2023-24 school year. The first day of school will be on August 17th and the last day on May 16th. Spring break is scheduled for the week of March 11th, which is the same week as most schools and colleges in Kansas. You can download a copy of the calendar on our website.

On May 6th the Education Foundation and the Booster Club are putting on a golf tournament fundraiser at the Stafford County Country Club. 


