SUPERINTENDENT'S NEWS

It is somewhat ironic that election day happens in the same month as Thanksgiving. Well I should say "election ad season" as opposed to election day. As a proud American, I am grateful for the opportunity to participate in the democratic process. The political ads on the other hand, I could do without. Ads from both sides promote fear of the other side and do not really promote an attitude of thanksgiving.

Even though we have some challenges in the world right now, it is important to recognize what we are thankful for. There is a link to this survey on our website and social media feeds as well. Your input would be greatly appreciated.

Last spring, the board of education began work on a strategic plan for the district. We held two community meetings to gather input from staff, parents, and patrons. One of the primary themes that emerged from those meetings was the need for updates to our facilities. Concerns expressed were those inherent with older buildings as well as ensuring the safety of our students.

With that in mind, the board has contracted with Wiens and Company out of Hutchinson to do a full-scale assessment of our school district facilities. They will evaluate the current state of our buildings, identify needs, and explore potential solutions with budget estimates. The process will involve work with a committee of staff, parents, and patrons over the next few months. The committee will work to prioritize those needs and potential long-term and short-term solutions. It will then be up to the board of education and the community to decide how to proceed to address these identified needs.

I'd like to remind parents that they have access to the PowerSchool portal to keep track of student grades, attendance, and meal account balances. This portal also allows parents to configure preferences for the automated messaging system. This includes phone, email, and text messages. Unless preferences are changed by parents, they will receive a call, email, and text message for all automated messages. Log in to your PowerSchool portal if you would like to change those preferences or contact the school office for assistance.


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PIE 4 PROM IS BACK!
