Notes from the Superintendent

As I'm writing this article, we are in the midst of the summer Olympic Games. These events bring us together with national pride. There are no political divisions, we are just all cheering for Team USA. I enjoy watching these elite athletes perform at the highest levels and accomplish personal bests. It was exciting to see a Swedish pole vaulter set a new world record in the pole vault. His first time to set a new world record was in 2020. Since that time he has broken his own record an additional 8 times. That is an impressive feat and makes me wonder how that is possible. How does one continually break a record like that? The answer is pretty simple: you just have to raise the bar. You do as well as you think you can and keep raising the bar.

That is the theme for our new school year: "Raising the Bar." Just as in pole vault or high jump, we cannot achieve at higher levels unless we keep raising the bar and establishing higher expectations. We need to keep raising the bar for expectations with things like: how we treat one another, how hard we work in the classroom and on the field, behavior, and attendance.

One area of raising expectations in our schools is where

the use of cell phones is concerned. Students are in school to learn and cell phones have proven to be a major distraction and source of discipline problems. Our goal is to remove that distraction from them during the school day. While cell phones are a useful tool for a lot of things, in the school setting they get in the way. We will be communicating the specifics of our solution to this problem in the coming weeks when it is ready to roll out. The restroom and concession facility at the football field is coming along. We had a lot of people contribute to this project which has helped our district complete this project. Very soon we will have a much better space for students and patrons with handicap accessible restrooms.

The overall condition of our facilities is in dire need of improvement. We've been working on a potential bond project for a few years now. That has been on hold with the potential for significant cuts to water rights that could do severe harm to our community. You may have heard that Quivira will not be calling for more restrictions in 2025. This is good news in the short term. However, we will need to know the long-term solution before moving forward with any major project. I am hoping we will know more toward the end of the calendar year. I'm looking forward to another great school year full of purpose, passion, and pride and raising the bar.

Online Student Enrollment

Student registration is done through an online process and started in late July. Information about enrollment and links for the online enrollment portal can be found on our website homepage. If you have not enrolled yet, there is still time.

Parents of returning students should have received an email in July. This email contained instructions and a special code needed for the enrollment process. If families do not have a valid email in our system, a letter was mailed to parents with detailed instructions and this special code. If you did not get an email or letter about the registration process, please contact the office.

Parents of students who are new to the district will need to create an online account to start the process. See our website for the link.

There is an option to pay online or you can choose to mail payment. If there is a discrepancy with any dollar amount that is owed, just choose the cash/check option and it will be corrected in the office.

Proof of identity must be provided for students enrolling in a school district for the <u>first time</u>. Proof of identity can be a birth certificate, SS card, a copy of a court order placing a child in the custody of DCF, or a certified transcript or similar pupil records from another school district where the student was previously enrolled.

A doctor's physical is required for students who are enrolling for the first time in the state of Kansas. Students who were previously enrolled at USD 350 or another Kansas school do not need to have an additional physical exam. You should contact the Health Department or your doctor if an exam is required.

To enroll in kindergarten, a student must be 5 years old on or before Aug 31st. To enroll in first grade, students must be 6 years old on or before Aug 31st OR have completed an accredited Kindergarten program. These age limits are established by state law and the school district has no flexibility to adjust these requirements.

I hope everyone had a great summer and were able to enjoy the extra family time that the summer season creates. As the calendar turns from July to August we get to shift our focus to this upcoming school year and all the excitement that brings. On a personal note this is an exciting school year for me as I begin my first year here at USD 350.

As school starts you won't see many major schedule changes other than LS time will now be called advisory time. Other than that the bell schedule for the Junior/Senior High will stay the same as last year. One minor change for the kids to be aware of is there will no longer be second breakfast pick up time. There will still be grab and go breakfast for kids to pick up at 7:50.

For the High School kids one change that could affect them is students will not be able to leave the building during lunch if they have a "F" in any class. Parents will be notified on the Friday before that their student will not be able to leave the school for open lunch the following week. This will last all of the following week and if after the next week's progress report is ran the next Friday and there are no "F" grades their student will be able to leave for open lunch

As cell phone use continues to be a hot topic in school nationwide we as a district are going to implement the use of Yondr pouches for the 24-25 school year for

grades 7-12. The purpose of the pouches is to help eliminate student distraction during the school day and to maximize the learning environment. Each student will receive a bag at the start of the school year and will be required to lock their cell phone/smart watch in their pouch at the start of first hour. High School students that are not on the ineligible list will be able to have the phones unlocked during lunch time. At the start of sixth hour the phones will then be locked in the pouches till the end of advisory time. Students leaving for the day for various reasons will be able to have their phones unlocked in the office before they leave for the day.

Finally, I would like to touch on attendance. We would like to hit the goal of having every kid in school every day of the year. With that being said we understand that situations in life happen and kids will have to miss school from time to time. As a school we ask that when a kid is going to be absent from school that parents please reach out and let the office know about the absence as soon as possible.

Early Education at USD 350

It is the goal of USD 350 to provide preschool for all children starting at age 3. Preschool students attend either a morning or afternoon session Monday through Thursday and on some Fridays. The first day of preschool is the same as all other students on Aug.

Preschool students are subject to the same \$50 book & material fee that applies to all other students. Those that qualify for free lunch will have this fee waived.

Our preschool is operated jointly by USD 350 and the special education cooperative in Pratt. Students must go through the screening process to be eligible to attend preschool. If you missed the spring screenings, you can call the school office or the special education cooperative at 620-672-7500 to make an appointment.

For the most part, children must also be toilet trained before attending preschool. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the elementary office.


